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Principal's Message

Dear Irfan Families,

Assalamu Alaykum wa Rahmatullahi wa Baraktuhu. I pray this newsletter finds you in the best of health and faith. Alhamdulillah, we have come to the end of another very hectic and fruitful year.

Term four is usually one of the busiest periods of the academic year. This term we had the opportunity to refine and develop a number of important areas including our vision, staff allotment for 2017, and annual school improvement plan. Irfan College has been working towards becoming an established and functional school since its inception in 2013. Next year will be Irfan's fifth year of meeting the educational needs of Sydney's Muslim community. In this next phase of our school's growth, major investments will be made to improve the quality of education provided at Irfan College.

Vision

The first major improvement that is instrumental to the growth of our school is a clear vision. We will be starting 2017 with the following vision:

'Raising thinkers and leaders who have confidence in their Australian-Muslim identity, with a deeply rooted motivation to actively do good in the world'.

These are the attributes we are looking to cultivate in our graduates. We want graduates who are thinkers and leaders. We want our graduates to be able to make meaningful and informed decisions in regards to their future careers.

We want graduates who are confident with their identity and are comfortable with being an Australian and Muslim concurrently, rather than perceiving them as incompatible entities. The more we deem the two entities as conflicting, the longer it will take for our communities to integrate and develop a voice that is truly reflective of Islam's compassionate nature.

We want graduates who have a deeply rooted motivation to actively do good in the world. A deeply rooted motivation stems from a strong moral purpose based on Islamic ethical principles and humanitarian values. We want our students

to be active citizens who are agents of unconditional goodness to all of humanity.

Staff Allotment for 2017

Staff allotment was another area that kept us really busy this term. Our executive team conducted a number of interviews to finalize our teacher needs for 2017. We will be commencing secondary department with experienced and overly qualified teaching staff Alhamdulillah. Likewise, we also had the opportunity to gain some new teaching staff in our primary department. The learning support department was also an area that we have enriched in 2017 with one learning support coordinator, two full-time primary learning support teachers and one part-time secondary learning support teacher (please refer to back of newsletter for staff allotment of 2017).

Annual School Improvement Plan

Our annual school improvement was also refined and developed this term as we decided on our priorities for 2017, teaching comprehension, enhancing teacher performance, and developing an effective wellbeing model and behaviour management system. We have chosen teaching comprehension as a priority to address one of our school's concerns which is low literacy levels. As a result of the Schools Leading Learning project which will be ending this year, we have identified English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EALD) as the main contributor for our low literacy levels and therefore, in 2017 we will be developing EALD pedagogies such as teaching comprehension through phonemic awareness. All of our school's professional development initiatives will be based on this priority to develop whole school approaches and improve teacher quality.



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K-2 Literacy and Numeracy Action Plan

We would also like to use this opportunity to inform our families that Irfan College has been enlisted to partake in the K-2 Literacy and Numeracy Action Plan (LNAP). The LNAP is a state funded initiative provided to schools from a low socioeconomic status that will be funding our college with \$64,000 per annum for the next four years. The aim of this project is to improve student outcomes in literacy and numeracy in the foundational years of kindergarten to year two.

ACER Review

Another highlight of this term was the independent review conducted by the Australian Council of Educational Research (ACER) at Irfan College. ACER conducted the review based on the National School Improvement Tool (NSIT). The NSIT was endorsed by the Standing Council on School Education and Early Childhood (SCSEEC) at its meeting on 7 December 2012 and has been made available to all Australian schools for use in their school improvement planning from 2013. The NSIT Review is specifically designed to equip Principals, Boards and Staff with the data they need to plot their school's current position against international effective practice and to plan a focussed approach to school improvement appropriate to the context of their school. Alhamdulillah, the ACER review confirmed that the measures being implemented at school are evidence-backed and deserve commendation. Below is a snippet from the review:

'Irfan College has developed an effective school operation in a very short period of time since its opening. The current leadership team is driving a strong agenda for the provision of a holistic notion of quality education into the future. The Governing body, staff and parents are supportive of this notion.'

End of Year Presentation Night

Like every year, we spent the last couple of weeks preparing for the end of year presentation night.

The program was filled with a number of protocol speeches from federal and state MPs, student performances, and award ceremonies. A lot of positive feedback was provided by the parents regarding this year's presentation night.

I would like to thank our dedicated team at Irfan College for their extraordinary efforts this year. From the executive team to teaching staff, admin to maintenance, everyone did an amazing job to ensure that students were getting what they deserved. Finally, I would like to extend my best wishes to our year six graduates. I pray to Allah (swt) that He bestows His assistance and grants them success in this life and the next.





I Need My Monster!





Term 4 has been an exciting term for Year 5. This term in Science, students have been exploring 'Earthquakes'. Using plasticine, students have made models representing tectonic plates. They had the opportunity to explore how earthquakes occurred, how they are linked to tectonic plates and the various types of movements that take place during an earthquake. Students added captions using cardboard on toothpicks. They labelled and described their understanding of how each plate moves, what happens at the plate boundary during this movement and how this might cause earthquakes. Furthermore, students also investigated how scientists study and record earthquake activity using seismometer.







Overall, students have been engaged with lots of interactive learning experiences covering a range of key learning outcomes.
